Badges

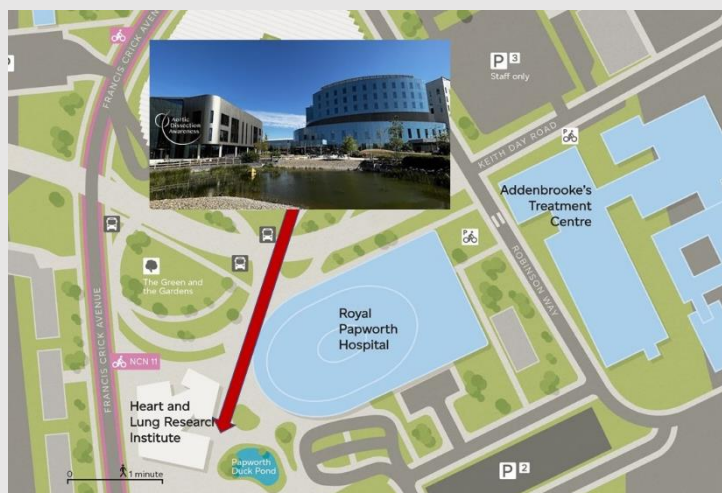
All delegates and guests will receive a name badge at the Welcome desk. Please wear your badge at all times.

Directions

The nearest mainline station is: **Cambridge** (Station Road, Cambridge, CB1 2JW). A taxi to the venue takes 10 mins. Directions from the M11: Leave the M11 and head north on the A1309 Hauxton Road to **Trumpington Park & Ride**. Park for free and take **Guided Bus A** directly to the hospital (a 5-minute journey). It's quicker and cheaper than driving. There are blue badge spaces located close to the bus stops. www.cambridgeparkandride.info
On-site parking (incl. blue-badge parking): The closest car park is **Car Park 2**, a short walk from the venue (CB2 0AX). Details and parking prices here: www.sabaparking.co.uk/car-park/addenbrookes-car-park-2-cambridge
There is blue badge parking available in **Car Park 2**. There is very limited blue-badge parking outside of the HLRI building which will be reserved for guests with severely restricted mobility who request it on a first-come, first-served basis.

Accommodation

We recommend delegates stay in the local area the night before the event, to make it easier to arrive at the venue for a 9am start. For best rates, use www.booking.com to book one of these nearby hotels (*rates quoted are as of 08/05/23*):

- **Holiday Inn Express, Cambridge**, CB1 3LH had rooms from £86 per night for 18th September.
- **ibis Cambridge Central Station**, Cambridge, CB1 2GA had rooms from £146 per night for 18th September.
- **Clayton Hotel, Cambridge**, CB1 2FB had rooms from £215 per night for 18th September.
